October is Pregnancy & Infant Loss Awareness Month



In the Houston area, on October 13th, the Wave of Light memorial will be presented by Missing




Volunteer Spotlight: Justine Warburton

Justine was born in England, but work brought her to the US, where she got married and created a beautiful blended family. While she is now an "empty nester," she fills her time with classes at the Glassell School of Art, working on a master's degree in fine art, traveling, visiting her children, and volunteering with Bo's Place.

When asked what brought her to Bo's Place, Justine shared that "on July 14, 2018, our youngest son, Toby, was killed tragically in a boating incident. Our world was turned upside down and we began our journey of grief. Three years after the tragedy, feeling emotionally stronger, I realized that I wanted to be able to share my experience of death and more importantly wanted to be able to help others in grief."

Now into her second year of volunteering, Justine spoke to the impact of her role, saying "Volunteering fills me up. Volunteers see a direct impact that their time has in lifting up participants who are in their lowest and most vulnerable points in their life. It gives me

Upcoming Training: "Good Grief for Helping Professionals"

Save the date for our upcoming *Good Grief for Helping Professionals*. This online training is designed for professionals wanting to build their skills to more effectively support the bereaved. The session provides an overview of current grief theory, various indicators of grief, and how to support grieving individuals across the lifespan. Led by Bo's Place mental health professionals, this 3-hour training will focus on supporting the bereaved client using grief-specific therapeutic elements through a variety of interventions.

Participants will gain tools and resources to support their work with the bereaved, and interventions ready for implementation in a variety of settings. Opportunity for 3 continuing education credits will be available.
